A bill of the following title transmitted from the Senate was read at length the first time as follows:

By the Senate Judiciary Committee: A bill (S. F. 94, substitute for H. F. 71), for a joint resolution of the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Minnesota, making application to the Congress of the United States, under article five (5) of the constitution, for the submission of an amendment to said constitution, making United States Senators elective in the several states by popular vote.
