**State of Minnesota—Proclamation by the Governor.**

Whereas a vacancy exists in the office of State Senator for the Third Senatorial District by reason of the formal resignation of Hon. Sylvanus B. Lowry, who was elected at the last general election to represent said district in the Senate of said State;

Therefore, Proclamation is hereby made that agreeably to the provisions of an act entitled "an act to regulate elections in this State, and to reduce the several acts related to the same to one act," approved March 12, 1861 the said vacancy so occurring will be filled by the qualified voters of the counties of Stearns, Todd, Cass, Wadena, Otter Tail, Andy Johnson, Clay, Douglas, Becker, Polk, Penobscot, Morrison, Crow Wing, Aiken, Itasca, Buchanan, Carlton, St. Louis and Lake, the same constituting the third Senatorial District aforesaid, at a special election to be held therein on Saturday the sixth day of September, A. D. 1862; said election to be conducted and the returns made in the manner prescribed by the law regulating general elections in this State.


Given under my hand and the great seal of the State, at the Capitol, in the City of Saint Paul, this twenty fifth day of August, A. D. 1862.
