WRIT OF ELECTION.

To the people of the State of Minnesota; to the Secretary of State of Minnesota; to the county auditor of Ramsey county of said state; and to all election officials of the 41st legislative district in said county and state, and to all election officials of the various precincts and election districts in said 41st legislative district, greeting:

Whereas a vacancy now exists in the term of State Senator from the 41st legislative district, Ramsey county, Minnesota, caused by the death of the late State Senator Martin J. Conroy;

Now, therefore, I, J. A. O. Preus, governor of the State of Minnesota, acting by and under the authority and direction contained in Section 17, Article 4 of the constitution of the State of Minnesota, and pursuant to Chapter 167, Session Laws of Minnesota for the year 1915, and with the advice of the attorney general of the State of Minnesota, hereby issue, publish and declare this my writ of election for a special election to be held throughout said legislative district on Tuesday, the 4th day of November, 1924, and I do hereby direct that a special election be held on that day in said district in order that there may be chosen at said election a State Senator from the 41st legislative district aforesaid, to fill said vacancy and to represent said district in the senate of the State of Minnesota.

And I do further order, declare and direct that candidates for said office be nominated by petition or certificate of voters in the form and manner prescribed by Sections 371 to 374, both inclusive, and section 400, all in the General Statutes of 1913; provided, all nominating petitions shall be filed with the county auditor of Ramsey county, Minnesota, not later than Saturday, October 25, 1924.

As soon as the time herein allowed for filing such nominating petitions or certificates of voters has expired, the Ramsey county auditor shall cause to be placed upon the proper general election ballot the names of all candidates so nominated for the office of state senator from the 41st legislative district.

The issuance of this writ of election shall constitute and be deemed official notice to all persons throughout the state of Minnesota, and particularly to those residing in said 41st legislative district, of said special election, but let this writ of election be published one time forthwith in a legal newspaper in the capital city of the state of Minnesota, and the local authorities at their discretion may also give such further and additional notice as they deem desirable.

It shall not be necessary to create any new precincts, appoint judges or make new registration of voters for the special election hereby called, but the precincts shall be the same and the hours of opening and closing the polls and the places of voting and the judges and clerks of election and the registers shall be the same as those of the general election to be held on said date.

Except as otherwise provided in this writ the provisions of the laws of the state of Minnesota made and provided for the election at general elections of state senators shall so far as practical govern and control said special election. The candidate for senator from said 41st legislative district receiving the largest number of votes cast at said special election shall be declared to be elected and a certificate to that effect shall be delivered forthwith to him by the proper authority.

To this end and as authority and direction therefor
have you then and there this writ.
