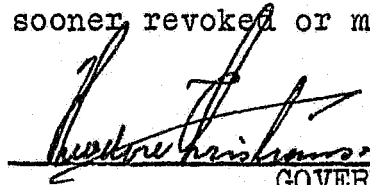

GOVERNOR'S ORDER PROVIDING PROTECTION FOR WOOD DUCKS

Whereas, under the regulations of the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, the wood duck is protected by a continuous close season, and under the Minnesota law is afforded no protection whatever; and,

Whereas, the Game and Fish Commissioner has investigated and is of the opinion that this conflict between the State and Federal Law will cause confusion and result in undue depletion of the wood duck,

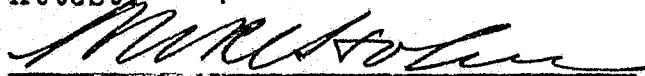
Now, Therefore, I, Theodore Christianson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, pursuant to authority vested in me by Section 5640 G.L. 1923, do hereby find that additional restrictions are necessary for the protection of the wood duck, and I do hereby order that no wood duck shall be taken, killed or had in possession in any number at any place in the State of Minnesota. This order shall remain in force and effect until the close of the 1929 regular session of the Legislature of the State of Minnesota, unless sooner revoked or modified.
