GOVERNOR'S ORDER NO. 1 OF 1932.

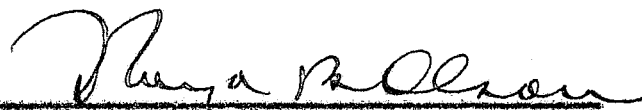
ORDER PROVIDING ADDITIONAL PROTECTION FOR WILSON SNIFE
(JACK SNIFE), RAILS AND GALLINULES:

Whereas the Director of Game and Fish of the Minnesota Department of Conservation has investigated the necessity of providing additional protection for Wilson Snipe (Jack Snipe), Rails and Gallinules and has found that these species are in danger of undue depletion,

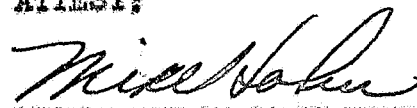
Therefore, I, Floyd B. Olson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, pursuant to authority vested in me by Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 5640, do hereby order that Wilson Snipe (Jack Snipe), Rails and Gallinules may be taken for a period of sixty-one days only, from October 1st to November 30th, both dates inclusive, each day from one-half hour before sunrise to sunset, except on the opening date, which shall be 12 o'clock noon.

It is further prescribed that the number of such Wilson Snipe (Jack Snipe) which may be had in possession shall not exceed 20; it is also further prescribed that the number of Rails and Gallinules which may be had in possession shall not exceed 20.
