GOVERNOR'S ORDER NO. 4 OF 1932

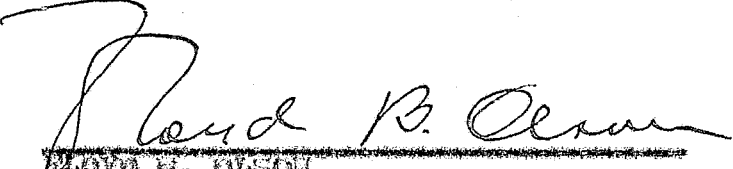
ORDER PROVIDING ADDITIONAL PROTECTION FOR MIGRATORY GAME BIRDS:

Whereas the Director of Game and Fish of the Minnesota Department of Conservation has investigated the necessity of providing additional protection to Migratory Game Birds and has found that these species are in danger of undue depletion,

Therefore, I, Floyd B. Olson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, pursuant to authority vested in me by Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, Section 5640, do hereby order that a person may take in one day, during the open season, not to exceed 12 of any one or 12 in the aggregate of the following kinds of birds: mallards, pintails, baldpates, mergansers, coots and widgeons; and not to exceed ten of any one of the following kinds or ten in the aggregate of: blue-bills, green wing teal, blue wing teal, cinnamon teal, canvas-back, redhead, ringneck, shoveler and gadwall; and may not take in any one day a mixed bag of more than 12 ducks and coots, or have in his possession a mixed bag of more than 20 ducks and coots of all species.

The taking of wood duck, ruddy and bufflehead, during the year 1932, is prohibited.
