GOVERNOR'S ORDER NUMBER 23, EXTENDING ADDITIONAL PROTECTION
TO BEAR IN THE STATE OF MINNESOTA DURING THE YEAR 1936.

Whereas, it has been represented to the Director of
Game and Fish that Bear are in danger of undue depletion in the
State of Minnesota, and

Whereas, the Director of Game and Fish has in-
vestigated and has presented me with the results of his investi-
gation and has recommended that further protection be given to
Bear in the State of Minnesota:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Hjalmar Petersen, Governor of
the State of Minnesota, by virtue of and pursuant to authority
vested in me by Section 5640, G.S. 1923, do hereby order that
the season for the taking of Bear shall be the same as that for
the taking of deer for 1936, or from November 15th to 25th, both
dates inclusive, and that there shall not be any open season for
the taking of Bear between April 15th and May 15th, 1937; and
that the season for the taking of Bear herein provided shall be
effective in the same county or counties as the open season for
the taking of deer for 1936, as follows:

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Cook, Lake, St. Louis, Carlton, Pine, Kanabec,
Koochiching, Itasca, Aitkin, Crow Wing, Cass,
Hubbard, Clearwater, Beltrami, Lake of the Woods,
Roseau; all of that portion of Kittson and Marshall
Counties lying east of the old Pembina Trail running
from the north boundary of Kittson County to the south
boundary of Marshall County; all of that part of
Becker County lying east of the Minneapolis, St. Paul
and Sault Ste. Marie Railway Tracks; all of that part
of Mille Lacs County lying North of the Great Northern
Railway track running through Milaca, Foreston and
Rock.

This order shall remain in force until the close of
the 1937 regular Session of the Legislature of the State of
Minnesota, unless sooner revoked or modified.
