

EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE ORDER 92-8 DECLARING A STATE OF EMERGENCY IN SOUTHWESTERN MINNESOTA

I, ARNE H. CARLSON, GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the applicable statutes, do hereby issue this Emergency Executive Order:

WHEREAS, on June 16 and 17, 1992, an outbreak of multiple tornadoes, accompanied by hail, lightening, heavy rainfall, and other high winds, struck portions of Minnesota; and

WHEREAS, communities in the counties of Murray, Wright, and Yellow Medicine have sustained extensive damages to both private and public property; and

WHEREAS, counties in the surrounding area are also reporting significant damages as a result of this storm; and

WHEREAS, the resources of local governments and private relief agencies are being fully utilized to respond to this crisis; and

WHEREAS, those resources are expected to become exhausted as the recovery process continues;

NOW, THEREFORE, I hereby declare that:

A State of Emergency exists in the State of Minnesota and do direct the Division of Emergency Management, in conjunction with the Federal Emergency Management Agency and other state and federal agencies to determine the need for supplementary disaster aid and to provide any such assistance as necessary under existing state and federal authority.

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 1990, Section 4.035, subd. 2, this Order is effective immediately and shall remain in effect until rescinded by proper authority or it expires in accordance with Minnesota Statutes 1990, Section 4.035, subd. 3.
