The committee adopted the amendment, 5-0.

The committee adopted the amendment, 5-0.

Senator Betzold moved bill contents as amended be incorporated into S.F. 361 and that the bill pass as amended to Judiciary Committee and the State Government Budget Division.

S.F. 361- Skoglund: Government data classification and dissemination provisions technical corrections.

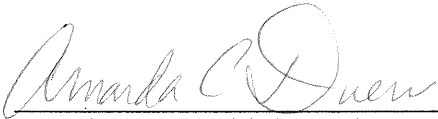
Senator Skoglund explained the bill.

Katie Engler, Department of Administration, spoke in favor of the bill.

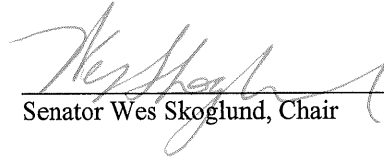
Senator Skoglund moved that the contents of the bill be adopted.
