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4 BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the State of Minnesota:

5 For the 2005 session of the 84th Legislature, the Secretary
6 of the Senate may purchase postage to furnish each member of the
7 Senate 5,500 stamps. Each member named as chair of a standing
8 committee in the Senate resolution designating committee
9 assignments may be furnished with an additional 1,000 stamps for
10 the necessary business of the committee.

11 An additional postage allowance of 1,000 stamps is
12 authorized for the Senate Minority Leader; five other members of
13 the minority designated by the Senate Minority Leader; and five
14 members of the majority designated by the Senate Majority Leader.

15 Each member of the Senate shall receipt to the Secretary of
16 the Senate for the postage received.

1 A Senate resolution
2 relating to the attendance of members of standing
3 committees at meetings and seminars; providing for the
4 payment of expenses.
5
6 BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the State of Minnesota:
7 Members of a standing committee or subcommittee of the
8 Senate, and employees thereof, upon approval of the Committee on
9 Rules and Administration or its chair, may attend meetings and
10 seminars, including but not limited to meetings of the National
11 Conference of State Legislatures and the Council of State
12 Governments and their committees, on subjects within the
13 jurisdiction of the standing committee or subcommittee.
14 Expenses incurred in attending these meetings and seminars
15 must be paid by the Secretary of the Senate with warrants drawn
16 on the Senate legislative expense fund.

1 A Senate resolution
2 relating to expenses of interns and law clerks.

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4 BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the State of Minnesota:

5 For the 2005 session of the 84th Legislature, each member
6 of the Senate may be reimbursed for the cost of meals and
7 transportation furnished by the member to any volunteer interns
8 assisting with the member's work, up to a maximum of \$50 during
9 each week the Legislature is in session.

10 Each member of the Senate may be reimbursed for the cost of
11 lodging furnished by the member to a volunteer intern assisting
12 with the member's work, if the intern is enrolled in an intern
13 program at a post-secondary institution outside the seven-county
14 metropolitan area, up to a maximum of \$400 during each month the
15 Legislature is in session.

16 The Secretary of the Senate may reimburse up to two
17 volunteer law clerks working in the Office of Senate Counsel and
18 Research for the cost of meals and transportation incurred by
19 them in their work, up to a maximum of \$50 during each week the
20 Legislature is in session.

21 Requests for reimbursement must be submitted to the
22 Secretary of the Senate monthly on forms provided for this
23 purpose. Requests by a member must include a certification by
24 the member that the amounts for which reimbursement is sought
25 have been paid to the interns. Requests for lodging
26 reimbursement must be accompanied by receipts or other suitable
27 documentation.

28 The Secretary of the Senate shall prepare and issue
29 warrants for payment of intern and law clerk expenses from the
30 Senate legislative expense fund.

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5 BE IT RESOLVED, by the Senate of the State of Minnesota,
6 the House of Representatives concurring:

7 The Commissioner of Administration shall reserve all
8 parking space necessary on the Capitol grounds, Capitol
9 Approach, and Aurora Avenue, in the State Office Building ramp,
10 and elsewhere in the capitol area for the use of the members and
11 staff of the Legislature for the 84th session of the
12 Legislature, allowing reasonable space for parking to the
13 general public having business at the Capitol. The Committee on
14 Rules and Administration of the Senate and the Committee on
15 Rules and Legislative Administration of the House of
16 Representatives may designate necessary personnel to work with
17 the Commissioner of Administration in this matter.

18 The Secretary of the Senate and the Controller of the House
19 of Representatives may deduct from the check of any legislator
20 or legislative employee in each year of the 84th session of the
21 Legislature a sum adequate to cover the exercise of the parking
22 privilege defined in this resolution in conformity with the
23 practice of the Commissioner of Administration.
