The minutes of the March 25 meeting were approved.

MSRS Administrative Bill - S.F. 349 (Chenoweth); H.F. 593 (Patton)
Mr. Groschen, Exec. Dir. of the MSRS went over the provisions and proposed amendments to the bill. Discussion followed.

The following amendments were passed by the commission:

Rep. Parish moved to amend on page 6, lines 29 and 30, strike "who has as least eight years of legislative service and"

Sen. Chenoweth moved to amend as follows:

Page 12, line 7, strike "\$2,500" and insert "\$3,000"; and on line 12 strike "\$2,500" and insert "\$3,000"

Page 21, line 16, strike Subd. 6 (for purpose of putting this subdivision in one section for all funds).

Staff was also given directions for further clarifying language.

S.F. 151 (Stokowski); H.F. 203 (Enebo) - Minneapolis Fire - Widows' Reinstatement Bill. Bill amends Laws 1965, Chapter 519. Pensions paid to firemen's widows terminated upon remarriage. This bill would allow the pension to be reinstated if the remarriage ends.

Rep. Patton moved to amend S.F. 151 (H.F. 203), the typewritten bill as follows:

Page 4, after line 1, insert a section to read as follows:

"Sec. 2. This act is effective upon approval by the city council of the city of Minneapolis and upon compliance with the provisions of Minnesota Statutes, Section 645.021."

Sen. Stokowski moved that S.F. 151; H.F. 203) as amended be recommended to pass.
Motion carried.

S.F. 152 (Stokowski); H.F. 202 Enebo
Sen. Stokowski explained that this bill would allow expenditures for Minneapolis firemen to travel outside the state.

Sen. Stokowski moved that S.F. 152; H.F. 202) be recommended to pass.
