Re: House Budget Proposal for FY 2022-23

The attached *Minnesota House of Representatives – Recommended Budget for Fiscal Years 2022-23* is transmitted for consideration and approval by the Committee on Rules and Legislative Administration. This budget has been prepared and is submitted to the Rules Committee in accordance with the Permanent Rules of the House, Article 8.01.

FY 2022-23 Recommended Budget

For the FY 2022-23 biennium, the House budget is recommended to be established at an expenditure level of \$83,423,251. This proposed budget is \$3.442 million more or about a 4.3% increase. The proposal would include a 3.4% or \$2.649 million increase to the general fund appropriation base and the use of \$3.060 million in carry-forward.

The proposed budget for FY 2022-23 will allow for the following:

- Funding to maintain of current staffing levels plus redistricting staff.
- Funding for the implementation of the currently suspended 2% COLA and 3.5% merit increases¹
- Funding for a 1% and 1% compensation budget increase
- Funding for increased health insurance costs and other non-salary operating budget increases
- Funding for a \$1,750 (3.76%) increase in Member salary effective July 1, 2021 as recommended by the Legislative Salary Council
- Funding of pre-pandemic operating trends for Member expense payments (per diems, travel, lodging, mileage, etc.).
- Funding of pre-pandemic trends for House non-salary operations (Information Technology maintenance and license renewals, communications, professional and other purchased services).
- Use of \$3.06 million in carryforward funds.

¹ Implementation of the suspended salary increases should not be consider ed until the end of session, when House resources are known.

Minnesota House of Representatives FY 2022-23 Budget Proposal Summary 4/5/2021

SPENDING

The proposed Minnesota House of Representative's budget recommends a total spending of \$83,423,251 for the FY 2022-23 biennium. This represents a \$3,442,800 or 4.3.% increase over the FY 2020-21 budget. The budget proposal includes operational increases for known cost increases such as Members' salary and insurance costs, as well as a 1% per year increase for staff compensation.

RESOURCES

The proposed budget is recommended to be funded from the following sources:

- 80,363,000 from the General Fund appropriation
- \$3,060,251 from the Carryforward account.

This budget request a General Fund appropriation increase of \$2,649,000 or 3.4% higher than the FY 2022-23 base budget for the House of Representatives.
