MS. PETTMAN: Hello Committee,
Chair, and members of the public, and the press, and
the general public. My name is Ms. Kim Annette
Pettman. I have a master's degree in library and
information science, a bachelor's in communication,
and I have been on a board and have been and currently
been on committees. I do some public engagement work
and also am a citizen advocate.

The reason that I am speaking to you about this matter regarding the State Office Building is because I have personally experienced some issues with the building, observed some struggles that the general public has dealt with this building, and also I dealt with another State building that had issues.

One thing I want you guys to really think about: The problems are very well documented, and many people from the public especially are very concerned about the cost. While I do believe that some of the issues of the cost might be related to historical preservation laws, and it sounds like we can't really do much about that. The thing is many, many issues are very serious with this building. I'm a person that got hurt at this building. Other people have gotten hurt too.

I worked in another State office building in

the '90s, it was the fall of 1997, it was called Capitol Square, another building that was being used in a different purpose from how it was originally intended. People brought their concerns up for decades. Many people were harmed when they worked in an unsafe building. I only lasted three weeks. I had an allergic reaction. Two doctors wrote a note saying that it was an unsafe building for me. That same week OSHA found out that the toxic black mold in that building was over the safe limits. But we knew, many people that worked there knew that it was a bad building. Please know that many people have brought their concerns to you about this building.

And please think about this: It is the holiday time and you or your business might be hosting people. Can you imagine if you knew that your roof was leaking, your pipes could bust because they already had, many people couldn't enter your building, you didn't have enough seating, people have gotten hurt, can you imagine how embarrassed you might be or worried as a host; and even if you were a business, same thing; or if you were visiting a place that had issues, you would be like, well, why didn't you fix it. Why are you inviting me here when you know you have problems.

This is a place where people need to be.

There is also many times where people, kind of like at schools, a lot of people are passing through hallways and it's not big enough. The hallways aren't even big enough. Many people have brought concerns to you.

I am also asking that you have a really open and transparent process where multiple people can give their input because sometimes things get missed in a design process while it's being designed, and it's a whole lot cheaper to address those issues before the construction is finished. I'm especially asking that not just a few select people be included in this, but please make it open and transparent. Please show people. Please let people shadow people with disabilities that might be using different types of mobility devices.

I personally am hoping that you will include much more seating for people so they don't have to sit on the floor, they don't have to sit on those little window sills that are in the small hallway across from the first floor elevators. Please provide bathrooms that are big enough for people, that have enough accessible stalls. People come in all shapes and sizes. Please provide a variety of seating options, and please also care for your workers who may need

accessibility, and please, please always have a very good hearing room layout so that nobody has to get turned away.

This is a place where people are to be welcome. I really hope that this will be a welcoming place. It makes the State run so much more efficiently if it's a working building where people are truly welcome. Please also include places where people can wait for rides in a way that they are not going to get in anybody's way. Please include everybody.
