1.2 relating to cannabis; transferring enforcement of edible cannabinoid products to

1.3 the Office of Cannabis Management; clarifying workplace testing for cannabis;

1.4 making technical changes related to the taxation of cannabis and related products;

1.5 replacing medical cannabis licenses with endorsements; establishing a petition

1.6 process to designate cannabinoids as nonintoxicating or approved for use in

1.7 lower-potency hemp edibles; authorizing lower-potency hemp edibles to contain

1.8 certain artificially derived cannabinoids created in making delta-9

1.9 tetrahydrocannabinol; allowing testing of certain hemp products to be performed

1.10 by labs meeting accreditation standards regardless of licensing status; authorizing

1.11 patients enrolled in the registry program to obtain cannabis flower from registered

1.12 designated caregivers; authorizing registered designated caregivers to cultivate

1.13 cannabis plants on behalf of patients enrolled in the registry program; authorizing

1.14 the Office of Cannabis Management to recall certain cannabis and related products;

1.15 transferring the duties of the medical cannabis program to the Office of Cannabis
