Senator Murphy moved the A-3 amendment. AMENDMENT PASSED.

Senator Murphy moved S.F. 2066, as amended be passed and rereferred to Crime Prevention. BILL PASSED.

Senator Murphy presented S.F. 1991, a bill clarifying current law that provides a pay differential to state employees who, as members of the National Guard or other reserves, are ordered to active military service and incur an earnings decrease as a result.

Testifying in support were: <u>Marybeth Theisen, St. Cloud, "See Attachment B."</u> and <u>Joan Lehmkuhl, St. Cloud, "See Attachment C."</u> They commented when someone is deployed – their payments do not go away. Some have very little time to prepare and they were never advised by their employer about the pay differential.

Senator Murphy moved S.F. 1991, be passed and placed on the Consent Calendar. BILL PASSED.

Senator Dille presented S.F. 1218, his resolution for ending Minnesota's feedlot war. "SEE ATTACHMENT F." Senator Dille moved the A-2 amendment. Senator Skoe pointed out on Page 1, line 12, after "years" insert "that" Senator Dille incorporated that into the A-2 amendment. AMENDMENT PASSED.

Senator Dille moved S.F. 1218 be passed as amended. BILL PASSED.

Senator Lourey moved to reconsider the vote on S.F. 2066. Senator Murphy moved that S.F. 2066 be rereferred to Judiciary Committee. BILL PASSED.

Senator Dille presented S.F. 1629, a bill relating to livestock loans and zoning. <u>"See</u> Attachment G."

Senator Dille moved that A10 amendment. AMENDMENT PASSED.

Gene Speltz, Rollingstone, MN, stated we need to focus on the next generation of family farmers.

Bruce Schmoll, Former Township Sup., Ripley Township-"See Attachments H & I." Bill Rowekamp, Co-owner Ripley Dairy, their project is stopped for at least a year.

Joe Swedberg, Hormel, support the bill.

<u>Charlie Meyer, Rollingston, MN</u>, need to look at economic analysis ordinance will have on local businesses.

<u>Mark Moenning</u>, <u>Dodge County</u>, stated he has spent a lot of time on this issue and outside influences have a lot of say over what they do.

<u>Della Schmidt, Winona Area Chamber</u>, support the small farmer.

Senator Dille passed out handout from Land Stewardship Project - "See Attachment J."

People testifying with concerns or in opposition were:

Kent Sulem, MN Association of Townships, "See Attachment K." He said on Page 5, line 27, the name needs to be changed to "MN Association of Townships" and on Page 8, line 34, change to "462-357" and line 36, change to "1g" AMENDMENT PASSED. He stated they support the bill as originally introduced. They have concerns with the A10 amendment. He said they do not want to be back here next year defending themselves.

<u>Harlan Madsen</u>, <u>President</u>, <u>AMC</u>, not necessarily opposed – just have concerns with one section.

<u>Carol Lovro, Association of MN Counties,</u> concerned with the local road improvement program.

Attachment passed out from MN Association of Cooperatives - "Attachment L."

Allene Moesler, League of Women Voters, "See Attachment M."

Thom Petersen, MN Farmers Union, support the loans and RFA provisions.

John Tuma, MN Env. Partnership, indicated certain provisions that would place more detours on local officials and they do not support that.

<u>Paul Solbocincki</u>, <u>Land Stewardship Project</u>, concerned with the fact it weakens local control, and public notices.

Senator Lourey moved the A11 amendment. AMENDMENT PASSED.

Senator Lourey moved the A9 amendment. Senator Dille opposes this amendment. AMENDMENT DEFEATED.

Senator Dille moved S.F. 1629, as amended, be passed and sent to Environment and Natural Resources Committee. BILL PASSED.
