Delete "Section 1"

Delete all of the A-1 amendment except the effective date.

Insert "Subd. 4. [ASSAULT BY STRANGULATION.] (a) As used in this subdivision, "strangulation" means intentionally impeding normal breathing or circulation of the blood by applying pressure on the throat or neck or by blocking the nose or mouth of another person.

(b) Unless a greater penalty is provided elsewhere, whoever assaults another by strangulation is guilty of a felony and may be sentenced to imprisonment for not more then five years or to payment of a fine of not more than \$10,000, or both."

Motion prevailed.

Senator Kleis moved an oral amendment, After "<u>STRANGULATION</u>" in the Subd. 4 title, insert "<u>OR ASPHYXIATION</u>.]" Under section "(<u>b</u>)" after "<u>strangulation</u>", insert "<u>or asphyxiation</u>"

Motion prevailed.

Senator Ranum moved that S.F. 934, as amended, be recommended to pass and rereferred to the Committee on Finance.

Motion prevailed.

Senator Skoglund assumed the Chair.

Senator Foley, chief author of S.F. 1156 (Criminal sexual conduct crimes coercion definition and harassment crime provisions expansion).

Kaarin Long, Attorney at the Sexual Violence Justice Institute, testified in support of the bill.

Senator Foley moved that S.F. 1156 be recommended to pass and re-referred to the Committee on Finance.
