Rome Hanson, President of the Ben Doran Foundation for the Arts and Sciences, testified in support of the bill.


Senator Ranum moved the A-4 amendment.

Motion prevailed.


Senator Ranum moved that S.F. 1139, as amended, be recommended to pass and referred to the Committee on Finance.
