

Senators Moua, Robling, Pappas, Pogemiller and Neuville introduced--

S.F. No. 1069: Referred to the Committee on Education.

1 A bill for an act

2 relating to higher education; creating a state adjunct
3 to the federal educational Upward Bound or Talent
4 Search Trio programs; authorizing the Higher Education
5 Services Office to administer the program;
6 appropriating money; proposing coding for new law in
7 Minnesota Statutes, chapter 136A.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

9 Section 1. [136A.861] [UPWARD BOUND OR TALENT SEARCH TRIO
10 PROGRAMS.]

11 The director may make grants to eligible public and private
12 postsecondary institutions located in this state for talent
13 search and upward bound programs. Program eligibility and
14 activities shall be the same as those under the federal Upward
15 Bound or Talent Search Trio programs as specified in Code of
16 Federal Regulations, parts 643 and 645, respectively, and other
17 applicable federal laws or regulations. An "eligible"
18 institution is an institution that has at any time received a
19 grant from the federal government under any of the federal Trio
20 programs created by United States Code, title 20, section
21 1070a-11. The director shall establish a competitive grant
22 process for the programs and develop grant application forms.
23 The director must award grants based on the merits of a proposal
24 in providing authorized program services. Grants shall be for
25 two years of program activities unless a shorter term is
26 requested. The director shall attempt to distribute grants

1 geographically throughout the state. The director must grant
2 all available funds in each grant cycle, provided there are
3 sufficient meritorious applications. A grantee must submit
4 reports to the director at the same time and containing the same
5 information as is required of grantees receiving federal Upward
6 Bound and Talent Search Trio program grants. The director may
7 require additional reports or information from grantees.

8 Sec. 2. [APPROPRIATION.]

9 \$5,000,000 in fiscal year 2006 and \$5,000,000 in fiscal
10 year 2007 are appropriated from the general fund to the director
11 of the Higher Education Services Office for the purpose of
12 section 1. This appropriation is added to the agency's
13 permanent budget base.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

8 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2004, section 135A.053, is
9 amended by adding a subdivision to read:

10 Subd. 3. [PERSONAL FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT AND
11 INVESTMENT.] Prior to conferring a baccalaureate or associate
12 degree, a public postsecondary institution shall determine
13 student proficiency in personal financial management and
14 investment. Students must understand fundamental economic and
15 consumer principles, be able to manage personal and household
16 finances, and develop a range of competencies that will enable
17 them to become responsible investors, savers, and consumers in a
18 free enterprise economy. The governing boards of private
19 institutions that grant associate and baccalaureate degrees are
20 requested to make the same determination of student proficiency.

Subd. 4. [RECOMMENDATIONS.] Each student association shall

10

recommend at least two and not more than four candidates for its

11

student member. By ~~January-2~~ April 15 of the year in which its

members' term expires, each student association shall submit its

recommendations to the governor. The governor is not bound by

these recommendations.

4 appropriating money; proposing coding for new law in
5 Minnesota Statutes, chapter 136F.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

7 Section 1. [136F.31] [CENTERS OF EXCELLENCE.]

8 Subdivision 1. [BOARD DESIGNATION.] The board must
9 designate at least three and up to eight different program
10 centers of excellence in manufacturing technology,
11 science/engineering, health care, information technology,
12 business, and teacher education. The board must determine the
13 form and required information contained in applications from
14 member institutions. A center of excellence must include no
15 more than one state university working with up to two community
16 and technical colleges.

17 Subd. 2. [CENTER SELECTION CRITERIA.] The board must
18 select programs based on institutional proposals demonstrating:

19 (1) a comprehensive academic plan that includes a seamless
20 continuum of academic offerings in the program area including
21 associate, baccalaureate, and customized training and continuing
22 education;

23 (2) a specific development plan that includes a description
24 of how the institution will pursue continuous improvement,
25 accountability and work toward becoming nationally recognized;

1 (3) identified commitments from employers that include a
2 measurable financial and programmatic commitment to the center
3 of excellence on the part of employers who will benefit from the
4 development of the center. A center for teacher education must
5 demonstrate support from local school districts;

6 (4) a commitment from the institution that demonstrates
7 support from the entire institution for the proposal, and that
8 new designated funding will not supplant current budgets for the
9 programs; and

10 (5) a separate endowment amount created for the program
11 within current institutional foundations.

12 Subd. 3. [ADVISORY COMMITTEE AND REPORTS REQUIRED.] A
13 center of excellence must create an advisory committee
14 representing local, statewide, and national leaders in the
15 field. By January 15 of each odd-numbered year, each designated
16 center must provide a report to the governor and the chairs of
17 the senate Higher Education Budget Division and the house Higher
18 Education Finance Committee that includes annual and integrated
19 data on program enrollment, student demographics, student
20 admission data, endowment growth, graduation rates, graduation
21 outcomes, employer involvement, and other outcomes as determined
22 by the board. A report under this subdivision must also include
23 the use of any funds made available by a legislative
24 appropriation for incentive payments to faculty or staff.

25 Sec. 2. [APPROPRIATION.]

26 \$12,500,000 in fiscal year 2006 and \$12,500,000 in fiscal
27 year 2007 are appropriated from the general fund to the Board of
28 Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities for
29 the purposes of section 1. Of this appropriation, \$2,500,000
30 each year is for incentive payments to faculty or staff for
31 initiatives that promote excellence in student learning. To the
32 extent practicable, the board must make payments under this
33 section available first to faculty or staff associated with a
34 designated center of excellence.

S.F. No. 1401: Referred to the Committee on Education.

2 relating to higher education; regulating membership on
3 the Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges
4 and Universities; amending Minnesota Statutes 2004,
5 section 136F.02, subdivision 1.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

7 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2004, section 136F.02,
8 subdivision 1, is amended to read:

9 Subdivision 1. [MEMBERSHIP.] The board consists of ~~15~~ 18
10 members appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of
11 the senate. At least one member of the board must be a resident
12 of each congressional district, except that congressional
13 districts containing all or part of 17 or more counties shall be
14 split in approximately half geographically along county lines
15 and one member must be a resident of each half. Three members
16 must be students who are enrolled at least half time in a
17 degree, diploma, or certificate program or have graduated from
18 an institution governed by the board within one year of the date
19 of appointment. The student members shall include: one member
20 from a community college, one member from a state university,
21 and one member from a technical college. The remaining members
22 must be appointed to represent the state at large.

23 Sec. 2. [EFFECTIVE DATE.]

24 Section 1 is effective the day following final enactment.

25 Of the three members added to the board by section 1, one shall

1 be appointed for an original two-year term, one for a four-year
2 term, and one for a six-year term. The governor shall determine
3 which term applies to an appointment. After the original terms,
4 all succeeding terms shall be six years.
