Charlie Weaver, Minnesota Business partnership, Rose Hermodson, Association of Teachers, William Spyra, teacher, Minneapolis High School, and Ted Kolderie, Education Evolving, testified in support of the amendment. Roger Aaronson, Minnesota Schools Principals Association, Grace Schwab, Minnesota School Board Association, and Jan Alswager, Education Minnesota, testified in opposition.

Sen. Kelley announced SF1055 would be laid over for possible inclusion in the Education Policy Omnibus bill.

Sen. Kelley passed the gavel to Sen. Skoe.

Sen. Kelley introduced SF1286. Mark Davison, University of Minnesota Office of Education Accountability and Kristen Peterson testified in support.

Sen. Kelley moved the following oral amendment:1) Page 2, line 8, delete "school" and insert "schools"; p2 line 9, delete "districts".

The motion prevailed.

Assistant Commissioner Pat Olson, MN Department of Education, testified in opposition to SF1286.

Sen. Skoe announced that SF1286 would be laid over for possible inclusion in the Education Policy Omnibus bill.

Sen. Kelley announced that due to the hour SF2135 and SF257 would not be heard.

Sen. Kelley introduced SF1148.

Sen. Kelley moved that the A-4 delete all amendment be adopted as written.

Sen. Skoe announced that SF1148 would be taken up again on Monday evening.
