Senator Linda Berglin, Chair of the Health and Human Services Budget Division, called the eighteenth meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday, March 16, 2005, in Room 123 of the State Capitol, St. Paul Minnesota.

The secretary noted the roll.

The first bill up on the agenda was S.F. 223, authored and explained by Senator Kubly, as follows:

<u>S.F. 223 (KUBLY):</u> A bill for an relating to health; modifying ambulance service provisions; modifying requirements for first responders and emergency medical technicians; providing for emergency suspension of certain requirements.

<u>S.F. 24 (SOLON):</u> A bill for an act relating to health; requiring the commissioner of health to develop a statewide cervical cancer prevention plan.

Page 1, delete line 11 and insert "to (f) , and if applicable in paragraph (g)."

Page 4, after line 14, insert:

"Sec. 3. [256.957] [HEALTH CARE QUALITY IMPROVEMENT ACCOUNT.]

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A health care quality improvement account is established in the general fund.

Sec. 4. [REBATE REVENUE RECAPTURE.]

Any money received by the state from a drug manufacturer due to errors in the pharmaceutical pricing used by the manufacturer in determining the prescription drug rebate shall be deposited in the health care quality improvement account established in Minnesota Statutes, section 256.957."

Amend to title accordingly

The **MOTION PREVAILED** and the amendment was adopted.

Senator Berglin returned to the chair at 10:20 a.m.

Senate File 23 was laid over.

Senator Solon assumed the chair at 10:25 a.m.

The six bill up for consideration was S.F. 540, authored and explained by Senator Berglin, as follows:

<u>S.F. 540 (BERGLIN):</u> A bill for an act relating to human services; authorizing a long-term care partnership program; modifying medical assistance eligibility requirements under certain circumstances; defining approved long-term care insurance policies; limiting medical assistance estate recovery under certain circumstances.

Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

"Section 1. [APPROPRIATION.]

\$150,000 in fiscal year 2006 and \$150,000 in fiscal year 2007 are appropriated from the lottery prize fund to the commissioner of human services for a grant to the Lake Superior Area Family Services for use in their gamblers outreach and counseling program. The unencumbered balance of the appropriation from the lottery prize fund in the first year of the biennium does not cancel but is available for the second year."

The MOTION PREVAILED and the amendment was adopted.
