Mr. Dressen who also serves as the Alexandria school district superintendent presented a report from the task force which examines how Minnesota can make schools financially more equitable, understandable, and accountable. "While current funding follows a model of 'access and equity' we do not believe the current funding system will bring that model forward," Dressen said.

The task force put forth a six-point plan that organizes Minnesota education funding into a five tier system: instructional services, local district revenues, innovative programs, categorical programs, and facilities and debt service.
