Future system failure is very likely


- Replaces water mains, sanitary and storm sewers throughout the entire campus.
- The majority of the systems were constructed in the 1950s and have far exceeded their useful life.

Asset Preservation Projects

- Health, safety and code compliance
- Fire sprinkling, detection and alarm systems
- Major mechanical and electrical utility systems
- Sewer and water infrastructure
- Abatement of hazardous materials
- Roof repair and replacement and structural deficiencies
- Tuck pointing, window and door replacement, fascia, soffit and foundation work
- Road, walkway and parking lot repair, replacement and maintenance

General Obligation \$7.4M **Immediate** needs to address life and safety concerns

Priority Determination

Project priorities are based on need and level of deficiency:

- 1. Critical projects require immediate action and address health, safety, and code compliance issues
- 2. Projects that will become critical in a short time if not corrected soon
- 3. Projects that require reasonably prompt attention

Timeliness of Need

Lack of asset preservation funding results in:

- Requiring DHS to use a large percentage of its limited repair and replacement operating funds to instead address critical and expensive asset preservation projects
- Prevents DHS from addressing routine preventative, predictive and corrective facility maintenance
- Compounds the existing deferred maintenance problem resulting in a substantial increase in the long-range deferred maintenance and renewal/replacement projects at DHS facilities
