

1.1 **Senator Mathews from the Committee on Civil Law and Data Practices Policy, to**
1.2 **which was re-referred**

1.3 **S.F. No. 4025:** A bill for an act relating to opioids; providing for the deposit and
1.4 allocation of opioid settlement proceeds; establishing two accounts in the opiate epidemic
1.5 response fund; eliminating a separate opioid account in the state treasury; modifying the
1.6 time frame for eliminating the opioid manufacturer registration fee and reducing license
1.7 fees; barring municipal claims against litigants in certain settled opioid cases; amending
1.8 Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 256.043, subdivision 1, by adding a subdivision; Minnesota
1.9 Statutes 2021 Supplement, sections 16A.151, subdivision 2; 151.066, subdivision 3; 256.042,
1.10 subdivision 4; 256.043, subdivisions 3, 4; Laws 2019, chapter 63, article 3, section 1, as
1.11 amended; Laws 2021, First Special Session chapter 7, article 16, section 12; proposing
1.12 coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 3.

1.13 Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:

1.14 Page 2, line 1, after "other" insert "related"

1.15 Page 2, after line 17, insert:

1.16 "(e) This section does not limit any causes of action, claims, or remedies, nor the authority
1.17 to assert, file, or enforce such causes of action, claims, or remedies by a municipality against
1.18 entities and individuals other than a released claim against a settling defendant."

1.19 And when so amended the bill do pass and be re-referred to the Committee on Finance.
1.20 Amendments adopted. Report adopted.
