Bill Description

HF2819-0 would allow conservation officers and other licensed peace officers to issue civil penalties for violations of certain snowmobile provisions and establish civil citation authority for violations of the state's recreational trespass law committed by those operating a snowmobile or off-highway vehicle (OHV).

Civil penalty fine amounts would be increased for violations already established in law: \$250 for first offense (currently \$100); \$500 for second offense (currently \$200); and \$1,000 for third and subsequent offenses (currently \$500).

The bill also allocates civil penalty fines collected for incidents which involve a snowmobiles to be deposited in the snowmobile trails and enforcement account.

Assumptions

The bill does not create any additional workload or other expenditures by the state or local law enforcement agencies. It gives an officer who has already detected a violation, described in law, the option to issue a civil citation. Civil citations are rarely issued by officers under the existing OHV authority. In fact, no civil citations have been issued in the past 3 calendar years.

The addition of snowmobiles, its application to the recreational trespass law for OHVs & snowmobiles, and increased penalty amounts will increase revenue into the respective accounts. However, the dollar amounts collected may be negligible compared to the overall account balances.
