# Article 1 – Agriculture Appropriations

**Article 1** makes appropriations to the Minnesota Department of Agriculture for fiscal year 2023. Detail for these appropriations can be found in the spreadsheet titled "Governor's Revised Recs and SF 4019" prepared by Hannah Grunewald of Senate Counsel, Research, and Fiscal Analysis (attached).

## Article 2 – Broadband Appropriation

**Section 1** appropriates \$170,000,000 from the general fund in fiscal year 2023 to the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development for the border-to-border broadband fund account under Minnesota Statutes, section 116J.396. This is a onetime appropriation to be used for the border-to-border grant program.

## Article 3 – Board of Water and Soil Resources Appropriation

Section 1 [103F.49] establishes a soil health cost-share program with the Board of Water and Soil Resources.

**Section 2** appropriates \$17,000,000 from the general fund in fiscal year 2023 to the Board of Water and Soil Resources to accelerate the adoption of soil health practices. The appropriation is available until expended and has a base appropriation of \$4,500,000 in fiscal year 2024 and thereafter.

# Article 4 – Agriculture Statutory Changes

Section 1 (17.041) amends the agricultural emergency account to allow funds to be spent on preparedness.

Section 2 [17.1016] allows the commissioner to establish and implement a grant program to support cooperatives.

Sections 3 - 7 amend the Agriculture Best Management Practices Loan Program.

Section 3 (17.117, subdivision 9) allows the commissioner to rescind uncommitted allocations.

Section 4 (17.117, subd. 9a) removes the requirement for local government entities to identify which account funds a project.

Section 5 (17.117, subd. 10) removes the requirement for the local lender to notify local government after loan closing.

Section 6 (17.117, subd. 11) removes the maximum loan stipulation of \$200,000.

Section 7 (17.117, subd. 11a) changes the eligibility for water projects.

Sections 8-10 amend the livestock investment grant program.

Section 8 (17.118, subd. 1) lowers the amount of qualifying purchases and removes the maximum award amount.

Section 9 (17.118, subd. 3) removes the maximum grant amount.

Section 10 (17.118, subd. 4) removes the requirement for the commissioner to have a waiting list.

Section 11 [17.994] establishes a soil health financial assistance program.

Section 12 (41A.21, subd. 2) changes the eligibility for the oriented strand board (OSB) production incentive.

Section 13 (41A.21, subd. 6) adds a paragraph to the appropriation for the OSB production incentive to allow 6.5% to be used to cover program administration costs.

Section 14 (41B.047, subd. 3) lowers the level of eligibility for the disaster recovery loan program.

Section 15 (223.17, subd. 7) removes the requirement for producers to file a breach of contract claim within 180 days for grain purchases.

Section 16 (223.17, subd. 7a) changes the statute reference for bond requirements and claims for grain sales. The new section referenced is in Section 19 of this bill.

Section 17 (223.175) changes the statement that must be included in each grain sales contract.

Section 18 (223.19) gives the commissioner the authority to make rules for the new provisions in section 19.

Section 19 [223.24] establishes a grain indemnity account and describes how it would be used.

Section 20 (232.22, subd. 5) removes the requirement for public grain warehouse operators to file an annual report.

Section 21 repeals statutes relating to grain sales bonds.
