Dear Members of the Senate Commerce and Consumer Protection Finance and Policy Committee:

On behalf of the Justice Action Network, the nation's largest bipartisan criminal justice reform organization, I am writing in support of legislation that establishes a pre-clearance process for individuals who seek to apply for an occupational license in Minnesota.

SF3036/HF3403, authored by Senator Mark Koran and Representative Zack Stephenson, requires state agencies and boards to establish a pre-clearance process to aid potential applicants in finding out if anything in their criminal background would prevent them from holding the occupational license.

Since 2015, 38 states and Washington, D.C. have increased transparency in licensing for individuals with criminal records. In 19 states and Washington, D.C., individuals with criminal records have a pre-clearance process to apply to state licensors at any time prior to enrolling into required education or training programs. By enacting this legislation, Minnesota will join other states in establishing a pre-clearance process.
