Subdivision 1. Adopting plans and budgets. Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 124E.03, subdivision 2, is amended to read:
Subd. 2. Certain federal, state, and local requirements. (a) A charter school shall
meet all federal, state, and local health and safety requirements applicable to school districts
(b) A school must comply with statewide accountability requirements governing standard
and assessments in chapter 120B.
(c) A charter school must comply with the Minnesota Public School Fee Law, section
123B.34 to 123B.39.
(d) A charter school is a district for the purposes of tort liability under chapter 466.
(e) A charter school must comply with the Pledge of Allegiance requirement under
section 121A.11, subdivision 3.
(f) A charter school and charter school board of directors must comply with chapter 18
governing requirements for employment.
(g) A charter school must comply with continuing truant notification under section
260A.03.
(h) A charter school must develop and implement a teacher evaluation and peer review
process under section 122A.40, subdivision 8, paragraph (b), clauses (2) to (13), and plac
students in classrooms in accordance with section 122A.40, subdivision 8, paragraph (d).
The teacher evaluation process in this paragraph does not create any additional employmer
rights for teachers.
(i) A charter school must adopt a policy, plan, budget, and process, consistent with
section 120B.11, to review curriculum, instruction, and student achievement and strive for
the world's best workforce. For the 2023-2024 school year through the end of the 2028-202
school year, a charter school must adopt a policy, plan, budget, and process consistent wit
section 120B.111 to review curriculum, instruction, and student achievement that is aligned
with the goal of having 90 percent of third grade students achieve grade-level reading
proficiency.
