Analysis of Minnesota's policies

Scientifically Based Reading Instruction—Tests and Standards: Minnesota requires a sufficient test of the science of reading, the Minnesota Teacher Licensure Examinations (MTLE) Elementary Education test, subtest I, contains the equivalent of a stand-alone reading test.

In its standards for elementary and special education teacher preparation, Minnesota requires teacher preparation programs to address the science of reading.

Provisional and Emergency Licensure: Because provisional and emergency licensure requirements are scored in *Provisional and Emergency Licensure*, only the test requirements for the state's initial license are considered as part of this goal.

Recommendations for Minnesota



Although Minnesota maintains standards that address all five components of the science of reading, NCTQ finds <u>considerable evidence</u> that nearly three quarters (74 percent) of all teacher preparation programs fail to explicitly cover all five components of scientifically-based reading instruction. Minnesota should exercise its leverage in the program approval process to ensure that the coursework required of aspiring elementary teachers is appropriately focused on the science of reading, and, if not, that the state plays a more active, supportive role in remedying knowledge gaps on the part of faculty teaching these courses.
