Bill Description

The bill establishes the Legislative Working Group on Special Education Tuition Billing that will consist of eight members (four representatives, four senators) with appointments to be made by June 15, 2022. The first meeting of the working group must convene by June 30, 2022. Minnesota Department of Education (MDE) must provide data when requested to the working group. The Legislative Coordinating Commission must provide technical and administrative assistance to the working group. The working group is required to issue a report to the Legislature by January 31, 2023. The group expires on February 1, 2023.

Assumptions

- 1. The working group will meet within the Capitol complex once during the interim in June 2022 for a total of one time in FY22. The group will meet twice a month during the interim from July 2022 to December 2022 and then one time during session in January 2022 for a total of 13 meetings in FY23.
- 2. All meetings would be held either entirely remotely or entirely in-person. If the meetings are held in a hybrid manner, that would require additional staffing to support the technology associated with the meetings.
- 3. The bill does not provide for payment of per diems or for the reimbursement of expenses of legislators serving on the working group. However, members could request reimbursement from the House and Senate for expenses of engaging in legislative activity. This fiscal note is based on the assumption that the members will be paid per diems and seek reimbursement for their expenses.
- 4. Legislative member meeting participation cost include the following per member, per interim meeting costs: per diem (\$86 senators, \$66 representatives), \$85 round trip mileage (152 round trip mile average) and lodging for half of the legislative members (\$150/night senators, \$150/night representatives).
- 5. This note does not include any additional cost that non-legislative agencies may incur for interaction with staff and/or participation in meetings as requested by the working group.
- 6. Senate Counsel, Research and Fiscal Analysis will provide support of a 0.05 FTE composite of staff time in FY23 (approximately 100 hours). House Research Department and House Fiscal Analysis Department will also provide support of a 0.05 FTE composite in FY23 (approximately 100 hours). For this fiscal note we assume existing staff will be utilized and cost may be absorbed, although that will depend on the priorities of the legislature and staff time required for competing projects.
- 7. The LCC will provide a 0.01 FTE of administrative staff support in FY22 (approximately 16 hours) and a 0.10 FTE of

administrative staff support in FY23 (approximately 200 hours). For this fiscal note we assume existing staff will be utilized and cost may be absorbed, although that will depend on the priorities of the legislature and staff time required for competing projects.
