

1.1 **Senator Chamberlain from the Committee on Education Finance and Policy, to**
1.2 **which was referred**

1.3 **S.F. No. 3052:** A bill for an act relating to education finance; requiring school districts
1.4 to provide access to menstrual products for students; increasing operating capital revenue
1.5 to fund school district purchases of menstrual products; appropriating money; amending
1.6 Minnesota Statutes 2020, sections 121A.21; 126C.10, subdivisions 13, 14.

1.7 Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:

1.8 Page 2, after line 19, insert:

1.9 "Sec. 3. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 126C.10, subdivision 13a, is amended to read:

1.10 Subd. 13a. **Operating capital levy.** To obtain operating capital revenue, a district may
1.11 levy an amount not more than the product of its operating capital revenue for the fiscal year
1.12 times the lesser of one or the ratio of its adjusted net tax capacity per adjusted pupil unit to
1.13 the operating capital equalizing factor. The operating capital equalizing factor equals ~~\$23,902~~
1.14 ~~for fiscal year 2020, \$23,885 for fiscal year 2021, and \$22,912 for fiscal year 2022 and~~
1.15 \$23,145 for fiscal year 2023 and later.

1.16 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective for revenue for fiscal year 2023 and
1.17 later."

1.18 Renumber the sections in sequence

1.19 Amend the title numbers accordingly

1.20 And when so amended the bill do pass and be re-referred to the Committee on Finance.
