Senator ...... moves to amend the delete-everything amendment (SCS3071A-2) 1.1 to S.F. No. 3071 as follows: 1.2 Page 1, after line 26, insert: 1.3 "Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 147.03, subdivision 1, is amended to read: 1.4 Subdivision 1. Endorsement; reciprocity. (a) The board may issue a license to practice 1.5 medicine to any person who satisfies the requirements in paragraphs (b) to (e). 1.6 (b) The applicant shall satisfy all the requirements established in section 147.02, 1.7 subdivision 1, paragraphs (a), (b), (d), (e), and (f), or section 147.037, subdivision 1, 1.8paragraphs (a) to (e). 1.9 (c) The applicant shall: 1.10 (1) have passed an examination prepared and graded by the Federation of State Medical 1.11 Boards, the National Board of Medical Examiners, or the United States Medical Licensing 1.12 Examination (USMLE) program in accordance with section 147.02, subdivision 1, paragraph 1.13 (c), clause (2); the National Board of Osteopathic Medical Examiners; or the Medical Council 1.14 1.15 of Canada; and (2) have a current license from the equivalent licensing agency in another state or Canada 1.16 and, if the examination in clause (1) was passed more than ten years ago, either: 1.17 (i) pass the Special Purpose Examination of the Federation of State Medical Boards with 1.18 a score of 75 or better within three attempts; or 1.19 (ii) have a current certification by a specialty board of the American Board of Medical 1.20 Specialties, of the American Osteopathic Association, the Royal College of Physicians and 1.21 Surgeons of Canada, or of the College of Family Physicians of Canada; or 1.22 (3) if the applicant fails to meet the requirement established in section 147.02, subdivision 1.23 1, paragraph (c), clause (2), because the applicant failed to pass each of steps one, two, and 1.24 three of the USMLE within the required three attempts, the applicant may be granted a 1.25 license provided the applicant: 1.26 (i) has passed each of steps one, two, and three with passing scores as recommended by 1.27 the USMLE program within no more than four attempts for any of the three steps; 1.28 (ii) is currently licensed in another state; and 1.29 1.30 (iii) has current certification by a specialty board of the American Board of Medical Specialties, the American Osteopathic Association Bureau of Professional Education, the 1.31

- 2.3 (d) The applicant must not be under license suspension or revocation by the licensing

  a licensee, or have been subject to disciplinary action other than as specified in paragraph
  (d). If an applicant does not satisfy the requirements stated in this paragraph, the board may
  issue a license only on the applicant's showing that the public will be protected through
  issuance of a license with conditions or limitations the board considers appropriate.
