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## S.F. No. 2678 – Practice of pharmacy modifications

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**S.F. 2678** expands the practice of pharmacy by allowing pharmacists to administer any prescribed intramuscular or subcutaneous medication. S.F. 2678 also specifies that pharmacists may participate in the placement of drug monitoring devices under a prescription, protocol, or collaborative practice agreement.

Section 1 (151.01, subdivision 27) expands the practice of pharmacy to include intramuscular and subcutaneous administration if under a prescription drug order. (Currently a pharmacist may administer intramuscular and subcutaneous drug administration for the treatment of alcohol or opioid dependence.) This section also authorizes a licensed pharmacist to participate in the placement of drug monitoring devices according to a prescription, protocol, or collaborative practice agreement.
