1.5	Section 1. GRANTS FOR NONPROFITS SERVING HOMELESS YOUTH.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Establishment. The commissioner of human services must establish a
1.7	competitive grant program for nonprofit organizations seeking to establish or expand services
1.8	for homeless youth that formalize situations where a family friend, relative, or neighbor
1.9	allows a youth between the ages of 18 and 24 to stay at the family friend's, relative's, or
1.10	neighbor's residence to avoid being homeless.
1.11	Subd. 2. Definitions. For the purposes of this section, "set of participants" means a youth
1.12	between the ages of 18 and 24 and a family friend, relative, or neighbor with whom the
1.13	youth is living to avoid being homeless.
1.14	Subd. 3. Administration. (a) The commissioner of human services, as authorized by
1.15	Minnesota Statutes, section 256.01, subdivision 2, paragraph (a), clause (6), shall contract
1.16	with a technical assistance provider to:
1.17	(1) develop guidelines, criteria, and procedures for awarding grants;
1.18	(2) serve as a consultant to the commissioner for selecting grantees;
1.19	(3) provide technical assistance to grantees;
