

1.1 **Senator Kiffmeyer from the Committee on State Government Finance and Policy**  
1.2 **and Elections, to which was referred**

1.3 **S.F. No. 4065:** A bill for an act relating to cosmetology; modifying Board of  
1.4 Cosmetologist Examiners provisions; amending Minnesota Statutes 2020, sections 155A.20;  
1.5 155A.23, subdivisions 8, 11, 18, by adding a subdivision; 155A.25, subdivision 1a; 155A.27,  
1.6 subdivisions 1, 5a, 6, 7, 10, by adding a subdivision; 155A.271, subdivision 1; 155A.29,  
1.7 subdivisions 1, 4; 155A.30, subdivisions 2, 3, 4, 6, 11.

1.8 Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:

1.9 Page 2, line 24, delete "As long as" and insert "While"

1.10 Page 2, line 25, delete "the board must ensure that"

1.11 Page 2, line 26, after "field" insert "is" and delete everything after "automatically" and  
1.12 insert "renewed without fees with a term ending when the instructor license expires."

1.13 Page 2, delete lines 27 and 28

1.14 Page 5, line 23, delete the new language and insert "The board may only issue one  
1.15 temporary license to an applicant."

1.16 Page 5, delete line 24

1.17 Page 6, line 4, delete everything after "licensee" and insert "so that the operator or salon  
1.18 manager license expires on the same date as the instructor license."

1.19 Page 9, line 23, strike everything after "by"

1.20 Page 9, strike line 24

1.21 Page 9, line 25, strike "is a corporation, association, company, firm, society or trust"  
1.22 and delete ", except that schools in the"

1.23 Page 9, delete lines 26 and 27 and insert "the school administrator. For purposes of this  
1.24 section, "school administrator" means the proprietor, if the applicant is a proprietorship; the  
1.25 managing partner, if the applicant is a partnership; the authorized officers, if the applicant  
1.26 is a corporation, association, company, firm, society, or trust; or, the dean, principal, or  
1.27 other authorized signatory, if the applicant is a school in the Minnesota State Colleges and  
1.28 Universities system or a secondary school."

1.29 Page 10, delete section 21 and insert:

2.1 "Sec. 21. **BOARD OF COSMETOLOGIST EXAMINERS LICENSING WORKING**  
2.2 **GROUP.**

2.3 Subdivision 1. **Membership.** The board of cosmetologist examiners licensing working  
2.4 group consists of the following eleven members:

2.5 (1) the executive director of the Minnesota Board of Barber Examiners;

2.6 (2) one licensed salon owner, appointed by the executive director of the board of  
2.7 cosmetologist examiners;

2.8 (3) one representative of a cosmetology school, appointed by the executive director of  
2.9 the board of cosmetologist examiners;

2.10 (4) a representative of a trade association in the cosmetology industry that operates in  
2.11 the state, appointed by the executive director of the board of cosmetologist examiners;

2.12 (5) one state employee from another state agency that works with health and safety  
2.13 issues, appointed by the governor;

2.14 (6) two members of the public who use cosmetology services, appointed by the governor;

2.15 (7) two senators, one appointed by the majority leader and one appointed by the minority  
2.16 leader; and

2.17 (8) two members of the house of representatives, one appointed by the speaker of the  
2.18 house and one appointed by the minority leader.

2.19 (b) The executive director or a designee shall serve as an ex officio.

2.20 Subd. 2. **Duties; report.** (a) The working group must submit a report to the chairs and  
2.21 ranking minority members of the legislative committees with jurisdiction over state  
2.22 government finance and policy by February 15, 2023. The report must:

2.23 (1) evaluate the recommendations in the 2021 Office of the Legislative Auditor program  
2.24 evaluation titled Board of Cosmetology Licensing and recommend whether and how to  
2.25 adopt the recommendations;

2.26 (2) evaluate the salon manager license and school manager license;

2.27 (3) evaluate the scope and requirements for special event services and homebound  
2.28 services permits and considering merging both permits; and

2.29 (4) evaluate an endorsement-based licensing structure.

2.30 (b) The report must include draft legislation to implement the recommendations of the  
2.31 working group.

3.1 Subd. 3. Meetings; chair. (a) The executive director of the board of cosmetologist  
 3.2 examiners must convene the first meeting of the working group by September 15, 2022. At  
 3.3 the first meeting, the members must elect a chair. Subsequent meetings of the working group  
 3.4 must be convened by the chair or the chair's designee.

3.5 (b) The working group may conduct meetings remotely.

3.6 (c) The chair shall be responsible for document management of materials for the working  
 3.7 group.

3.8 Subd. 4. Compensation; reimbursement. Members appointed under subdivision 1,  
 3.9 clauses (2) through (6) may be compensated and reimbursed for expenses as provided in  
 3.10 Minnesota Statutes, section 15.0575, subdivision 3.

3.11 Subd. 5. Administrative support. The Board of Cosmetologist Examiners must provide  
 3.12 administrative support and meeting space to the working group.

3.13 Subd. 6. Expiration. The working group expires February 16, 2023, or the day after  
 3.14 submitting the report required in subdivision 2, whichever occurs earlier.

3.15 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment."

3.17 Page 11, delete line 4

3.18 And when so amended the bill do pass and be re-referred to the Committee on Rules  
 3.19 and Administration. Amendments adopted. Report adopted.
