1.3 Page 3, line 1, delete "2,332,000" and insert "2,746,000"

1.4 Page 3, delete line 2 and insert "Unless otherwise noted, the appropriations in this
1.5 subdivision are from"

1.6 Page 4, after line 2, insert:

1.7 "\$241,000 in fiscal year 2023 is to collect race
1.8 and ethnicity data on all applications for
1.9 credentials issued by the Driver and Vehicle
1.10 Services Division. This base for this purpose
1.11 is \$68,000 in each of fiscal years 2024 and
1.12 2025.

1.13 \$173,000 in fiscal year 2023 is from the
1.14 general fund to the commissioner of public
1.15 safety to collect race and ethnicity data on all
1.16 applications for credentials issued by the
1.17 Driver and Vehicle Services Division."

1.18 Page 19, delete section 5

1.19 Page 25, after line 5, insert:

1.20 "Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2020, section 13.69, subdivision 1, is amended to read:

1.21 Subdivision 1. **Classifications.** (a) The following government data of the Department
1.22 of Public Safety are private data:

1.23 (1) medical data on driving instructors, licensed drivers, and applicants for parking
1.24 certificates and special license plates issued to physically disabled persons;

1.25 (2) other data on holders of a disability certificate under section 169.345, except that (i)
1.26 data that are not medical data may be released to law enforcement agencies, and (ii) data
1.27 necessary for enforcement of sections 169.345 and 169.346 may be released to parking
1.28 enforcement employees or parking enforcement agents of statutory or home rule charter
1.29 cities and towns;

1.30 (3) Social Security numbers in driver's license and motor vehicle registration records,
1.31 except that Social Security numbers must be provided to the Department of Revenue for
1.32 purposes of tax administration, the Department of Labor and Industry for purposes of

2.1 workers' compensation administration and enforcement, the judicial branch for purposes of
 2.2 debt collection, and the Department of Natural Resources for purposes of license application
 2.3 administration, and except that the last four digits of the Social Security number must be
 2.4 provided to the Department of Human Services for purposes of recovery of Minnesota health
 2.5 care program benefits paid; ~~and~~

2.6 (4) data on persons listed as standby or temporary custodians under section 171.07,
 2.7 subdivision 11, except that the data must be released to:

2.8 (i) law enforcement agencies for the purpose of verifying that an individual is a designated
 2.9 caregiver; or

2.10 (ii) law enforcement agencies who state that the license holder is unable to communicate
 2.11 at that time and that the information is necessary for notifying the designated caregiver of
 2.12 the need to care for a child of the license holder; and

2.13 (5) race and ethnicity data on driver's license holders and identification card holders
 2.14 under section 171.06, subdivision 3. The Department of Public Safety's Office of Traffic
 2.15 Safety is authorized to receive race and ethnicity data from Driver and Vehicle Services for
 2.16 the purposes of research, evaluation, and public reports only.

2.17 The department may release the Social Security number only as provided in clause (3)
 2.18 and must not sell or otherwise provide individual Social Security numbers or lists of Social
 2.19 Security numbers for any other purpose.

2.20 (b) The following government data of the Department of Public Safety are confidential
 2.21 data: data concerning an individual's driving ability when that data is received from a member
 2.22 of the individual's family.

2.23 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective for driver's license and identification
 2.24 card applications received on or after January 1, 2023."

2.25 Page 82, after line 5, insert:

2.26 "Sec. 10. **[161.369] INDIAN EMPLOYMENT PREFERENCE.**

2.27 As authorized by United States Code, title 23, section 104, paragraph (d), the
 2.28 commissioner may implement an Indian employment preference for members of federally
 2.29 recognized Tribes on projects carried out under United States Code, title 23, on or near an
 2.30 Indian reservation. For purposes of this section, a project is near an Indian reservation if
 2.31 the project is within the distance a person seeking employment could reasonably be expected

- 3.1 to commute to and from each workday. The commissioner, in consultation with federally
- 3.2 recognized Minnesota Tribes, may determine when a project is near an Indian reservation."
