In the case of a public safety 1.13 officer, killed in the line of duty includes the death of a public safety officer caused by 1.14 accidental means while the public safety officer is acting in the course and scope of duties 1.15 as a public safety officer. Killed in the line of duty also means if a public safety officer dies 1.16 as the direct and proximate result of a heart attack, stroke, or vascular rupture, that officer 1.17 shall be presumed to have died as the direct and proximate result of a personal injury 1.18 sustained in the line of duty if: 1.19

1.20 (1) that officer, while on duty:

(i) engaged in a situation, and that engagement involved nonroutine stressful or strenuous
physical law enforcement, fire suppression, rescue, hazardous material response, emergency
medical services, prison security, disaster relief, or other emergency response activity; or

(ii) participated in a training exercise, and that participation involved nonroutine stressful
or strenuous physical activity;

- 1.26 (2) that officer died as a result of a heart attack, stroke, or vascular rupture suffered:
- 1.27 (i) while engaging or participating under clause (1);
- 1.28 (ii) while still on duty after engaging or participating under clause (1); or
- 1.29 (iii) not later than 24 hours after engaging or participating under clause (1); and

- 2.1 (3) that officer died as a result of a disabling cancer of a type caused by exposure to
- 2.2 <u>heat, radiation, or a known or suspected carcinogen, as defined by the International Agency</u>
- 2.3 for Research on Cancer, and the carcinogen is reasonably linked to the disabling cancer;
- 2.4 (4) that officer died due to suicide secondary to a diagnosis of post-traumatic stress
- 2.5 disorder as described in the most recently published edition of the Diagnostic and Statistical
