

Market research studies



 Question: If there was a Boys & Girls Club in Hibbing, how important are each of the following in determining whether your children would participate?




• Question: If a Boys & Girls Club opened in Hibbing with a low or no cost membership, how many children in your household might participate?




• Question: During the school year, my children would most likely participate at the following times: (Check all that apply).


• Question: During the summer, my children would most likely participate at the following times: (Check all that apply).




 Question: Do you support bringing a Boys & Girls Club to Hibbing? If unsure, please share any questions or concerns.
