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WHY a Boys & Girls Club in Hibbing

- At least 363 youth in grades K-6 and at least 151 youth in grades 7-12 may participate in a Boys & Girls Club in Hibbing (BGC Survey distributed to Hibbing schools, 2021).
- Almost 90% of Hibbing's families identified lack of positive, affordable activities as a challenge facing children
 in the community (BGC Survey, 2021).
- 64% of Hibbing's 5th graders reported being home alone or somewhere unsupervised after school one or more days per week (Minnesota Student Survey, 2019).
- Over 4 in 5 youth in Hibbing report that they do not participate in non-athletic activities after school (Minnesota Student Survey, 2019).
- Over 1,000 Hibbing students are eligible for free & reduced price lunch, and nearly 1 in 5 families in Hibbing live below the powerty level (Minnesota Dept. of Education; American Community Survey, 5-year estimates, 2⁰¹² 2016). By the time these children reach 6th grade, they have an average of 6,000 fewer hours of out-of-sc learning time than their peers. (ExpandED Schools).

The Hibbing School District issued a letter of commitment indicating it is prepared to provide, at no cost, classroom and space to the Boys & Girls Club within its schools and, also at no cost, provide Hibbing students transportation to the after-school location(s) on regularly scheduled school days.

In-kind contribution: \$25,794.93

BGCH Operating Budget

The operating budget of the Boys & Girls Club of Hibbing, a charter club of the Boys & Girls Club of the Northland, is approximately \$250,000 annually.


