1.22	household member, if:
1.23	(1) the dissemination poses an imminent and serious threat to the official's safety or the
1.24	safety of an official's family or household member; and
1.25	(2) the person making the information publicly available knows or reasonably should
1.26	know of the imminent and serious threat.
1.27	(b) A person is guilty of a gross misdemeanor if the person violates paragraph (a) and
1.28	a law enforcement criminal justice official or an official's family or household member
1.29	suffers great bodily harm or death as a result of the violation.
1.30	(c) A person who is convicted of a second or subsequent violation of this section is guilty
1.31	of a gross misdemeanor.
