## Re: SF 2868 (Goggin) Agricultural Riparian Buffer Credit Establishment and Appropriation

Dear Chair Weber and Committee Members:

The Association of Minnesota Counties (AMC) is a membership-based organization representing all 87 Minnesota counties. We appreciate the opportunity to offer comments on SF 2868: Agricultural Riparian Buffer Credit Establishment and Appropriation.

Shortly after passage of the 2015 Buffer Law, AMC added a provision to its platform supporting adjusted tax treatment of buffered acres in compliance with the statutory requirements. Early proposals suggested establishing a credit program. However, in working with county staff, the Minnesota Department of Revenue, and landowners, it was clear that this would be a complex and costly system to operate, negating the benefits we had hoped to achieve.

AMC and the Minnesota Association of County Officers (MACO) instead worked with stakeholders to establish a tax-exemption program that could be more easily implemented and provide the desired benefit to landowners. AMC has since amended our platform to support, *"providing a tax exemption to landowners required to comply with the riparian buffer requirements under MS 103F.48, and the state should reimburse local governments for lost revenue."* 

We appreciate Senator Goggin's support and request adoption of the author's amendment to change this proposal from a tax credit to a tax exemption. With the adoption of the author's amendment, AMC is happy to offer its support of SF 2868.
