<b>Article 6. Miscellaneous provisions</b>	Sec. 5 modifies the food definition in 34A.01. When edibles containing small amounts of THC were legalized last year, they were excluded from the definition of food. This modification updates the statute reference to the new coding in the bill.
<b>Article 7. Temporary Regulation</b>	Sec. 1 modifies the food definition in 34A.01 on a temporary basis before the rest of the bill is effective.
<b>Article 9. Appropriations</b>	Sec. 1, subd. 9 appropriates money to the commissioner of agriculture.
