Veterinary education in MN

- UMN is only DVM educator in MN
 - graduate ~100 DVMs each year
 - also train residents & interns - future medical specialists & faculty
- Demand / Opportunity for DVMs is growing
 - facing increased competition from a consolidating private practice industry
 - other states have more lenient rules on who can practice in an academic setting

- Risk to the state

Solutions for the workforce crisis

- Multifaceted and complex
- University of Minnesota Institutional License
 - Competitive advantage
 - Allow the CVM to hire qualified faculty, residents, and interns from non-accredited colleges of veterinary medicine
 - License revoked when they leave the CVM

Risks of inaction

- Inadequate faculty
- Smaller large animal intern/resident pool
- Inadequate diagnostic pathology
- Reduced diversity
