I write to you today to eagerly support the Farm to School & Early Care Bills, SF2158 and include it in the final Agricultural Finance Omnibus bill to expand on farm to school funds.

As an employee at Renewing the Countryside, I want to share the importance of this bill. This increase in funding will allow us to develop stronger farm to school and early care initiatives, build supply chains and increase food safety in Minnesota School Districts. As the manager of a Farmers Market that is a food hub conducting the Farmers Market Aggregation project, leadership team member and early proponent of Farm to School I have seen firsthand the difference this makes in my community.

As a farmer myself, I can speak directly to the impact it makes on farmers. This encourages relationships with their local schools, which is a win-win in every community. When farmers work with the local schools, we can create a learning environment around where food comes from and teach children that their food choices impact their health and wellbeing. The children get really excited to try new things and were eager to then bring their parents to the market to get more (and encourage their parents to try them too!!).
