

Historic Sites & Facilities Asset Preservation


- Sites are part of statutorily defined Historic Sites
 Network in MN Statutes 138 <u>a state responsibility</u>
- MNHS is responsible for 150+ structures statewide
- Nearly half of these structures are over 100 years old
- Asset Preservation Projects for Historic Structures take specialized design and construction techniques as they all must follow the Secretary of Interior's Standards for the Treatment of Historic Properties
- Modern visitor centers are approaching life-cycle of repair or replacement


Replacement Value	Based on Archibus
Deferred Maintenance	Based on FCA/Archibus
Maintenance Inflow	Asset Preservation + Facilities Dept general fund Maintenance
Wear & Tear Outflow	+/- 3-4.0% of replacement value


