S.F. No. 50 – Menstrual Products for Students

Section 1. School health services. Requires a school district or charter school to provide access to menstrual products at no charge to students in grades 4 through 12. Defines "menstrual products."

Effective Date. Makes the section effective January 1, 2024.

Section 2. Total operating capital revenue. Increases the operating capital revenue for a district by \$2 times the adjusted pupil units for the school year to be used to supply menstrual products under Minnesota Statutes, section 126C.10, subdivision 14, clause (26).

Effective Date. Makes the section effective for revenue for fiscal year 2024 and later.

Section 3. Operating capital levy. Clarifies that the additional aid under section 2 is not used in the operating capital levy calculation.

Effective Date. Makes the section effective for revenue for fiscal year 2024 and later.

Section 4. Uses of total operating capital revenue. Adds that operating capital revenue can be used to pay for the costs and supplies of menstrual products which are required to be accessible to students.

Effective Date. Makes the section effective January 1, 2023.

Section 5. General education aid. Appropriates a blank amount in fiscal year 2024 and fiscal year 2025 from the general fund to the Department of Education.
