

1.1 Senator moves to amend S.F. No. 50 as follows:

1.2 Page 1, delete section 1 and insert:

1.3 "Sec. 1. [121A.212] ACCESS TO MENSTRUAL PRODUCTS.

1.4 A school district or charter school must provide students access to menstrual products
1.5 at no charge. The products must be available to all menstruating students in restrooms
1.6 regularly used by students in grades 4 to 12 according to a plan developed by the school
1.7 district. For purposes of this section, "menstrual products" means pads, tampons, or other
1.8 similar products used in connection with the menstrual cycle.

1.9 EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective January 1, 2024."

1.10 Page 2, line 10, after "units" insert "of the school district"

1.11 Page 5, delete section 5 and insert:

1.12 "Sec. 5. ANNUAL GENERAL EDUCATION AID APPROPRIATION; OPERATING
1.13 CAPITAL REVENUE FOR MENSTRUAL PRODUCTS.

1.14 (a) The appropriation under Minnesota Statutes, section 126C.20, is increased by the
1.15 following amounts for the fiscal years designated for the purposes of providing operating
1.16 capital revenue under Minnesota Statutes, section 126C.10, subdivision 13, paragraph (a),
1.17 clause (3):

1.18 \$ 1,679,000 2024

1.19 \$ 1,859,000 2025

1.20 (b) The 2024 increase includes \$0 for 2023 and \$1,679,000 for 2024.

1.21 (c) The 2025 increase includes \$187,000 for 2024 and \$1,672,000 for 2025.

1.22 EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment."

1.23 Amend the title accordingly
