

1.1 **Senator Cwodzinski from the Committee on Education Policy, to which was referred**

1.2 **S.F. No. 1473:** A bill for an act relating to education; removing barriers to teacher
 1.3 licensure; amending Minnesota Statutes 2022, sections 122A.09, subdivision 10; 122A.181,
 1.4 subdivision 4, by adding a subdivision; 122A.182, subdivision 1, by adding a subdivision;
 1.5 122A.183, subdivisions 1, 2, by adding a subdivision; 122A.184, subdivision 1; 122A.185,
 1.6 subdivisions 1, 4; 122A.635, subdivisions 3, 4; 122A.70, by adding a subdivision; proposing
 1.7 coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 122A; repealing Minnesota Rules, part
 1.8 8710.0500, subparts 8, 11.

1.9 Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:

1.10 Page 3, line 1, strike everything after "requested"

1.11 Page 3, line 2, strike everything before the period and insert "; at the board's discretion,
 1.12 the board may begin to accept and review licenses before July 1"

1.13 Page 3, after line 2, insert:

1.14 "**EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment."

1.15 Page 4, after line 22, insert:

1.16 "Sec. 6. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 122A.182, subdivision 4, is amended to read:

1.17 Subd. 4. **Application.** The Professional Educator Licensing and Standards Board must
 1.18 accept applications for a Tier 2 teaching license beginning July 1 of the school year for
 1.19 which the license is requested ~~and must issue or deny the Tier 2 teaching license within 30~~
 1.20 ~~days of receiving the completed application;~~ at the board's discretion, the board may begin
 1.21 to accept and review licenses before July 1.

1.22 "**EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment."

1.23 Page 9, after line 6, insert:

1.24 "(d) A school district or charter school must provide substitute teachers that receive a
 1.25 substitute teaching license through the pilot program with substitute teacher training. The
 1.26 board may remove a school district or charter school from the pilot program for failure to
 1.27 provide the required training.

1.28 (e) A school district or charter school must not require an employee to apply for a
 1.29 substitute teaching license, or retaliate against an employee that does not apply for a substitute
 1.30 teaching license under the pilot program.


1.31 (f) A school district or charter school must compensate an employee working as a
 1.32 short-call substitute teacher under the pilot program with the greater of \$200 per day or the
 1.33 employee's regular rate of pay.

2.1 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective for the 2023-2024 and 2024-2025 school
 2.2 years only."
