**S.F. 1362** makes technical corrections to how absentee ballot envelope are referred to in various statutes. In some instances, additional clarification is provided on which envelopes are being used or how they are to be used. These are non-substantive changes. There are three types of absentee ballot envelopes. The ballot is placed into the ballot envelope, which is a blank envelope. The secrecy envelope is placed into the signature envelope, which includes the voter information and certification. The signature envelope is placed in the return envelope, which is the outermost envelope that is used to mail the ballot back.
