# **COUNTY CHOICE PROVISIONS**

### Electronic Voting Systems-Proposed Amendment HF 1140/SF 1191

### Summary:

The proposed amendment permits Minnesota counties to have a full range of choices in adopting the most efficient and cost-effective assistive voting equipment upgrade options as we seek to replace outdated AutoMark ballot marking equipment.

This amendment language would allow assistive voting devices compatible with tabulators to seek certification at the state level.

- The Office of the Secretary of State supports this policy change as it will provide counties with further choice in the assistive voting equipment they use at their polling places. Secretary of State Simon has consistently supported this request from many Minnesota counties for over 4 legislative sessions.
- The language requires no jurisdiction to purchase this type of equipment. Still, it would allow additional vendors to seek state certification of their equipment giving counties, cities, and towns more options when considering replacing their assistive voting technology.
