Section 1. APPROPRIATION; UNIVERSITY OF ST. THOMAS CENTER FOR
MICROGRID RESEARCH.
(a) Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes, section 116C.779, subdivision 1, paragraph (j),
\$3,000,000 in fiscal year 2024 and \$400,000 in fiscal year 2025 are appropriated from the
renewable development account established in Minnesota Statutes, section 116C.779,
subdivision 1, to the commissioner of commerce for transfer to the University of St. Thomas
Center for Microgrid Research for the purposes of paragraph (b). The base in fiscal year
2026 is \$400,000 and the base in fiscal year 2027 is \$0.
(b) The appropriations in paragraph (a) must be used by the University of St. Thomas
Center for Microgrid Research to:
(1) increase the center's capacity to provide industry partners opportunities to test
near-commercial microgrid products on a real-world scale and to multiply opportunities for
innovative research;
(2) procure advanced equipment and controls to enable the extension of the university's

 commerce for transfer to the University of St. Thomas Center for Microgrid Research for
 capacity building and matching requirements as a condition of receiving federal funds. This
